Christian Education is Real Education



I once heard someone say, "Christian schools protect and isolate students from the real world. Parents who send them to Christian schools do not want their children exposed to the reality of what really goes on in this world. They want to protect them from the evil and sin that exists in the real world. They are sheltering their children."

I would say that for the most part this is not true at all. In a book that many Christian schools use to help define who they really are and what they stand for, ***12 Affirmations 2.0: Christian Schooling for a Changing World***, the author, Steven Vryhof, spells out twelve affirmations that we affirm at Christian schools. The sixth affirmation, which is an educational affirmation, says this: *"We address real problems and generate real products."* It goes on to say that, *"Christian schooling offers learning experiences that are meaningful and relevant. Because Christian school people strive to see the world with clear-eyed honesty, they seek whole life stewardship in which work is worship and brokenness is healed. Vocational minded people penetrate the status quo and work for Christian alternatives that replace injustices and failures with peace and beauty."*

At Sunnyside Christian School we, with God's help, do our best to live up to this affirmation. We must take our mission statement very seriously in order to do that. It says we *"Provide a Christ-centered, Bible-based, quality education for distinctly Christian living."* Distinctive Christian living is taught in our Christian homes, here at school and in the churches our families attend. Our expanded mission statement goes on to say, *"We exist to develop the whole child: spiritually, academically, socially and physically. Students are challenged to accept Christ as Savior and Lord, to develop a Christ-like character and work to their full potential in all they do."*

Students who attend our school know what the real world is and how to live and work in that world. They know that the real world is God's world. Until one recognizes that, one cannot truly understand what the real world is all about. We do not shelter our students from the real world at all. We teach them that the world God created for us is the real world and has many flaws that are the result of sin. Our challenge is to bring up succeeding generations to be a transforming influence in the community in which God places them.

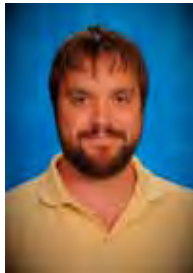

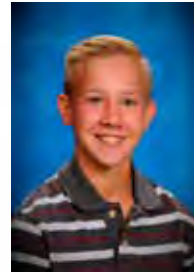

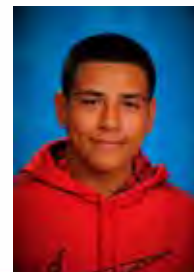
